WHAT IS IT LIKE?

The Poverty Simulation provides participants with the opportunity to assume the role of a low-income family member living on a limited budget. The experience is divided into four 15-minutes sessions, each of which represents one week in which you must provide for your family and maintain your home.

We can sympathize with low income circumstances but going through one of these simulations allows you to put yourself in a "virtual poverty situation" and it makes one aware of a whole new dimension of things that people encounter and have to deal with on a daily basis. It really gave me an entirely different outlook.
